Jerry Jones purchased the Dallas Cowboys in 1989 and named Jimmy Johnson as the new head coach. Jones became the first owner in NFL history to guide his team to three league championships in his first seven years of ownership. In the last 36 years, 36 different owners have entered the National Football League. Of that group, only Jerry Jones and Robert Kraft of New England have guided their franchises to more than two Super Bowl championships.

Jerry Jones' efforts in the area of sports marketing and promotion have created a vivid imprint on the landscape of the NFL and American sports culture. Approved by the voters of Arlington, TX in November 2004, the AT&T Stadium, with the design driven by Jones' influence, opened for the first regular season game in September 2009 with over 105,000 fans.

Mr. Jones and his wife Gene have been major philanthropists. For the past 17 seasons they have dedicated the Thanksgiving Halftime Show as the kick off for the Salvation Army's Red Kettle drive. In April 2014 Jones received the prestigious Horatio Alger Award in Washington, D.C.

Jones graduated from Arkansas in 1965 with a Bachelor of Science and earned a Master of Arts degree that same year. He and his wife live in Dallas with their children, all of who work for the Dallas Cowboys.

Douglas M. Johnston is President and founder of the International Center for Religion & Diplomacy (ICRD).

A distinguished graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Dr. Johnston holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from Harvard University and has served in senior positions in both the public and private sectors. Among his government assignments, he was Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy; Director of Policy Planning and Management in the Office of the Secretary of Defense; and planning officer with the President's Office of Emergency Preparedness. He has taught courses in international security at Harvard and was the founding director of the university's Executive Program in National and International Security. Dr. Johnston is a Captain in the Naval Reserve and, at the age of 27, was the youngest officer in the Navy to qualify for command of a nuclear submarine.

Prior to his current position, Dr. Johnston served as Executive Vice President and COO of the Washington-based Center for Strategic and International Studies. In addition to his managerial duties, he chaired the Center's Preventive Diplomacy Program and its Maritime Studies Program. His publications include *Religion, the Missing Dimension of Statecraft* (1994); *Foreign Policy into the 21st Century: the U.S. Leadership Challenge* (1996); *Faith-based Diplomacy: Trumping Realpolitik* (2003); *Religion, Terror, and Error: U.S. Foreign Policy and the Challenge of Spiritual Engagement* (2011); and *Religion and Foreign Affairs: Essential Readings* (2012).

Dr. Johnston's hands-on experience in the political/military arena coupled with his work in preventive diplomacy, has guided the work of ICRD since its inception. Under his leadership, the Center helped end the 21-year Civil War in Sudan, and eased religious tensions between Muslim, Hindu and Buddhist regions in Kashmir.

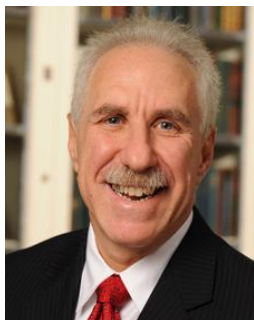

Paul B. Rothman is the Frances Watt Baker, M.D., and Lenox D. Baker Jr., M.D., Dean of the Medical Faculty, vice president for medicine of The Johns Hopkins University, and CEO of Johns Hopkins Medicine. As dean/CEO, Rothman oversees both the School of Medicine and the Johns Hopkins Health System, which together encompass six hospitals, hundreds of faculty and community physicians and a self-funded health plan.

Rothman was born in New York City in 1958 and grew up in Bayside, Queens. He began his research career as an undergraduate at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He completed his B.S. in biology in 1980 and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He then entered medical school at Yale University. He received his medical degree in 1984, earning a place in the prestigious Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society.

He went on to a medical residency and rheumatology fellowship at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City before joining the medical faculty of the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1986. There, he also completed a postdoctoral biochemistry fellowship with Dr. Frederick W. Alt, a Howard Hughes Medical Institute investigator, studying immunoglobulin class-switch recombination. At Columbia, Rothman rose to become the Richard J. Stock Professor of Medicine (Immunology) and Microbiology and chief of the pulmonary, allergy and critical care division.

A molecular immunologist, Rothman's research focused on immune system molecules known as cytokines. Specifically, he investigated the role these molecules play in the normal development of blood cells, as well as the abnormal blood-cell development that leads to leukemia. His work was consistently funded by the National Institutes of Health.

In 2004, Rothman accepted a position as head of internal medicine at the Carver College of Medicine at the University of Iowa. In 2008, he was named dean of the Carver College of Medicine and leader of its clinical practice plan, a role in which he served for four years. In July 2012, he became the 14th dean of The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and just the second CEO of Johns Hopkins Medicine.

Rothman's honors include a James S. McDonnell Foundation Career Development Award, a Pfizer Scholars Award, a Pew Scholar in the Biomedical Sciences Award, a Leukemia Society of America Scholar Award and the Pharmacia Allergy Research Foundation International Award. He is a member of the American Society for Clinical Investigation and is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians. He was elected as a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Sciences and as a member of the American Clinical and Climatological Association. He is serving as President of the Association of American Physicians for 2014-15. Rothman is married to Dr. Frances Meyer, a gastroenterologist. They live in Baltimore County and have three children: Alissa, Daniel and Eric.
