Dennis Muilenburg is chairman of the board, president and chief executive officer of The Boeing Company. He oversees the strategic direction of the Chicago-based, \$94.6 billion aerospace company. With approximately 140,000 employees across the U.S. and in more than 65 countries, Boeing is the world's largest aerospace company and top U.S. exporter. It is the leading manufacturer of commercial airplanes, military aircraft, and space and security systems, and a provider of global services.

Muilenburg became chairman of the board in March 2016, chief executive officer in July 2015 and president in December 2013. Until July 2015, Muilenburg served

as vice chairman, president and chief operating officer of Boeing, where he supported the company's aerospace business operations and focused on specific growth enablers, including important global relationships.

Before that Muilenburg served as president and chief executive officer of Boeing Defense, Space & Security (BDS). Earlier, Muilenburg was president of BDS's Global Services & Support business, and vice president and general manager of the Boeing Combat Systems division. He also held program management and engineering positions on F-22, Airborne Laser, High Speed Civil Transport and the Condor reconnaissance aircraft, among others.

Muilenburg, who joined Boeing in 1985, is a member of the board of directors of Caterpillar Inc., the U.S.-China Business Council, the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation and Northwestern Memorial Hospital. He serves on the boards of trustees for the National World War II Museum and Washington University (St. Louis).

Mitchell E. Daniels, Jr.

President Purdue University Naples Beach Hotel, River of Grass Ballroom Friday, April 19, 2019



Mitchell E. Daniels Jr. became the 12th president of Purdue University in January 2013, at the conclusion of his second term as Governor of the State of Indiana.

At Purdue, President Daniels launched a series of initiatives called <u>Purdue Moves</u> to provide bold answers to some of the greatest challenges facing higher education today. The four pillars of <u>Purdue Moves</u> are affordability and accessibility, transformative education, world-changing research and STEM leadership. They will guide the university in its mission to deliver higher education at the highest proven value. Since President Daniels took office in 2013 there has been an overall decrease in the cost of

attending Purdue. A first-of-its-kind partnership with Amazon is also saving Purdue students an average of 31% on their textbooks each year.

Daniels came to Purdue at the conclusion of his term as the 49th Governor of Indiana. He was elected Governor in 2004, in his first bid for any elected office. He was reelected in 2008, receiving more votes than any candidate for any public office in the state's history.

In 2005, he led the state to its first balanced budget in eight years, and without a tax increase, transformed the nearly \$800 million deficit he inherited into an annual surplus of \$370 million within a year. The governor also repaid hundreds of millions of dollars the state had borrowed from Indiana's public schools, state universities and local units of government and reduced the state's overall debt by 40%. Governor Daniels left Indiana with a budget surplus, reserve funds equal to nearly 15% of annual spending, and its first AAA credit rating.

Daniels first became interested in public service while serving as chief of staff to Senator Richard Lugar. He also served as senior advisor to President Ronald Reagan and Director of the Office of Management and Budget under President George W. Bush.

Daniels, who is also the author of the best-selling book, "Keeping the Republic: Saving America by Trusting Americans," earned a B.A. from the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University in 1971, and his law degree from Georgetown University in 1979. He and his wife, Cheri, have four daughters and six grandchildren.
