Kenneth W. Lowe

Speaker: Kenneth W. Lowe – President and C.E.O., The E.W. Scripps Company

Mr. Ken Lowe was named president, chief operating officer and a director of The E.W. Scripps Company in January 2000 and was elected president and chief executive officer of The E.W. Scripps Company in October 2000. Prior to rejoining the corporate office in Cincinnati, Mr. Lowe was chairman and C.E.O. of the Scripps Networks. He founded and launched Home & Garden Television (HGTV); managed the Food Network; and oversaw the launch of the company's third network, Do It Yourself (DIY), as well as Scripps' newest network, Fine Living. He also oversaw the acquisition of the Shop at Home retailing network. Mr. Lowe joined Scripps in 1980 as general manager of the company's

radio properties. In 1988, he became vice president of programming, promotion and marketing for the company's nine network-affiliated television stations. Mr. Lowe began his career in radio with Southern Broadcasting in 1969 and continued with various management positions in radio and television with Harte-Hanks Broadcasting in the late 1970's. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in radio, television and motion pictures from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Mr. Lowe is on the boards of directors of Fifth Third Bancorp, Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce, 3CDC (Cincinnati Center City Development Corp.), Cincinnati USA Partnership (GCCC Partnership for Greater Cincinnati) and the Associated Press. He is a trustee of the Fine Arts Fund, on the executive committee for the Commercial Club, the board of trustees for the Cincinnati Museum Center. He is also a member of the board of advisors to the Department of Communication and the board of visitors for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Mr. Lowe was recently inducted into the Broadcasting and Cable Hall of Fame. He and his wife, Mary, reside in Cincinnati and Highlands, North Carolina.



Susan Lyne

Ms. Susan Lyne was named president and chief executive officer of Martha Stewart Living Omnimedia, Inc. (NYSE:MSO) in November 2004. Ms. Lyne is responsible for all aspects of the public media and merchandising company, which includes publishing, television, merchandising and internet/direct commerce business segments. She is also a member of the company's board of directors, which she joined in June 2004.

Prior to joining MSO, Ms. Lyne served as president of ABC Entertainment from January 2002 to April 2004, where she oversaw the development of recent hits including "Desperate Housewives," "Lost" and "Extreme Makeover, Home Edition." Ms. Lyne joined Disney/ABC in January 1996

as executive vice president of acquisitions, development, and new business for Walt Disney Pictures and Television. In March 1998, she moved to ABC, where she was in charge of the network's movies and miniseries, reviving this form with such critically acclaimed ratings successes as "Life with Judy Garland," "Tuesdays with Morrie," "Anne Frank" and the musical adaptation of "Annie," all of which won multiple Emmy Awards.

Before turning to television and film, Ms. Lyne spent 15 years in the magazine publishing industry. In 1987, she created and launched *Premiere Magazine* for News Corp. For eight years, she served as editor-in-chief and publication director, establishing *Premiere* as an industry leader. Ms. Lyne has extensive experience as a magazine editor at *City*, Francis Ford Coppola's San Francisco weekly, *New Times* and *The Village Voice*.
